... NEW LOOK VILLAGE HALL!



It's hoped work will start on a £350K new look Village Hall this autumn, thanks to the huge efforts of Faye Tan and the Village Hall committee. Here Faye explains how the plans were finalised and what they hope to achieve.

At our March open day we presented plans for extending and renovating the hall. These received unanimous support from all those who came but we are aware that some people were unable to attend that day. The full slide pack is available at Clipston.org and we have included some images here to give you an impression of how it might look.

The village hall committee have since reviewed the proposal and all the comments made at the open day and have decided to proceed by preparing more detailed plans to submit for planning

permission (this will include reviewing the wood cladding proposal). If planning permission is granted and we are able to secure the necessary funding, we hope to begin some external works in the autumn with the major internal works in early 2023.

There is still plenty of detail to be worked on, especially around the heating and lighting arrangements and there will be a huge workload to run a tender process and seek grant funding - if you feel able to help with this in any way, please get in touch.

The plans you see came about from

comments received at the January 2020 open day, input from regular user groups and research with other village halls. Whilst usage of the space and accessibility were prime considerations, so too were heritage and environmental factors as well as the future costs of running and maintaining the building.

The costs of redevelopment are likely to be in the region of £300-350k. We have raised and saved about 10% of this already and will be looking to secure external funding for the majority, seeking grants aimed at improving community buildings and energy efficiency.

Haddon Fields

Welcome to Friends of Haddon Fields. I would like to highlight some activities just completed and those coming up in the next few months.

In March, a working party of volunteers, led by Jules Howard built a **new pond** in the wildlife area surrounding the Field Centre. Everybody who came along seemed to enjoy getting involved getting muddy and wet to complete the pond and fill it with water from the stream. A great community success!

By the time you read this, we should have completed the **installation of a rainwater collection system**. The main aim of the installation is to collect rain water to ensure that we can keep enough water in the pond. Thanks to those who contributed a spare water butt, guttering and pipe work, or who funded the purchase of new materials.

As part of the **Queens Green Canopy** initiative to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, we will be playing our part by planting more trees in Haddon Fields. The Platinum Jubilee enclosure will be planted with 7 specimen Oak trees -with one in each corner of the heptagon shape - and then 'infilled' with more saplings, probably in November-December.

The dedications enclosure will be planted with specimen trees purchased by individuals, again later in the year, when the climate is more suitable for planting trees. Please see page 11 for details of how to get involved in this exciting village initiative.

As mentioned in the last edition, we made an application to the Kelmarsh Wind Farm Community Benefit (KWCB)



to help fund the installation of stock proof fencing around the two new plantation areas. I am pleased to say that our application was successful and as a result, we plan to install the fencing as soon as possible! If all goes to plan, we hope to officially 'open' the new plantation areas, although planting itself will not take place until later in the year.

Clipston Church News

As the pandemic appears to be drawing to a close, at the church we are looking at how we can return to 'normal' – whatever that is! We are still doing monthly Zoom meetings for those who are unable or unwilling to attend actual services and the benefice resources are stretched over seven parishes.

Finances have been severely hit with very few people actually able to attend services for some time. Fund raising has been difficult as we have not been able to organise events in the church as we had in the past. At the same time we have had to do some urgent work on drainage to avoid flooding of adjacent properties and fuel costs rising will mean that we will have to look carefully at opening the church in the coming Winter.

However, all is not gloom and doom. The wildlife area in the churchyard is now complete and already we are seeing some plants coming through in the uncut areas that have not been seen before.



The lovely pond is starting to bed in well and we are eagerly awaiting our first residents. The two sponsored benches near the pond provide excellent places to sit and reflect.

The Orbell café goes from strength to strength and we now have a team of willing helpers who run the café on a rota basis which has removed much of the pressure on Linda and Valerie who started the facility.

Our weekly house group continues to flourish where we meet at one of the groups houses and discuss our faith, the Bible, the world and the village. The eating of cake is generally involved.

Unfortunately the saga of the church spire and our battle with the Diocese to get authority to undertake the repair work continues.

We are trying to make sure that people know what is going on at the church and many of you will have seen that the village Facebook site is regularly updated with details of services and events. As always, everyone is welcome to our services and the house group meetings. If you think it might be for you, give me a call to talk about it.



Oz the Wonderdog

Oz the lurcher was catapulted into the limelight in May, when he featured in The Guardian to promote *Wonderdog* a new book written by his owner, Clipston author and Zoologist Jules Howard.

It took Jules, a regular Guardian columnist, three years to write and research *Wonderdog*, which explores the story of how scientists came to understand what dogs think, feel and know about the world. Oz joined Jules and his family part way through writing the book, and gave Jules a much more personal insight into the special bond between dog and man. In his Guardian article, Jules revealed his conviction that dogs can feel actual love rather than the more scientific description of 'attachment' towards their human companions. For a community like Clipston where dogs seem to almost outnumber people, we feel Jules' book may be very popular! Published by Bloomsbury Sigma it's available from Amazon and in all the usual bookshops (£17.99).

The children have been learning about all sorts of interesting events and discussing topical issues including the discovery of Shackleton's ship Endurance, 107 years after it became trapped in Antarctica, and Earth Day, when they thoughtfully discussed the origins of this annual event and its influence on modern day Climate Emergency activists. For charity work, the School and Eco Council organised a Cake Bake and raised over £265 for Red Nose Day and on the sporting front, younger children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in the Superhero Sports Festival with other schools.

All the children have enjoyed hearing from authors during virtual "Meet the Author" sessions this term and four pupils in Upper Key Stage 2 represented the school in the East Midland's Heat of the National Literacy Trust's Reading Champion's Quiz. The event was open to children aged 10 to 16 and as such they were competing against teams with much older students, so we were even more proud of their achievement as the second highest scoring primary school! 
66-year old's 2000 mile charity trek
